
Lesson 4: First Steps to Set Up a Sewing Machine

- 1. Look at the paperwork
 - a. Safety instructions
 - b. Quick start guide
 - c. Instruction manual
 - i. Parts of the sewing machine
 - ii. Sewing machine accessories
 - d. Warranty information
 - e. Registration
- 2. Connect to power
- 3. Insert the needle
- 4. Attach the presser foot

Bonus: Sew straight stitches on your machine. No thread is needed, just notebook paper.

Lesson 5: How to Wind a Bobbin on Your Sewing Machine

- 1. Put the spool of thread on the spool pin.
- 2. Pull the thread from the spool into the thread guide.
- 3. Wrap the thread around the tension disk.
- 4. With the end of the thread between the top and bottom discs of the bobbin, push it up through the hole on the top disc.
- 5. Pull the thread through until you have a tail about 4-5 inches.
- 6. Set the bobbin on the winding spindle. Push it to the right to snap it in place.
- 7. Pull the thread taut and hold the tail end of the thread firmly. Step on the foot control so the bobbin starts spinning at a steady pace (not too fast). Don't let go of the thread.
- 8. Once the center cylinder of the bobbin is covered with thread, lift your foot off the foot control to stop the bobbin. Trim the tail as close to the top of the bobbin as you can.
- 9. Step on the foot control to finish winding the bobbin until it's full. The thread should be evenly distributed on the bobbin.
- 10. Clip the thread leaving a tail of a few inches.
- 11. Push the winding spindle back to the left and remove the bobbin.



How to Insert a Bobbin





Lesson 6: How to Insert a Bobbin Into Your Machine

Front-Loading Bobbin

- 1. Turn off the main switch.
- Raise the needle to the highest position by turning the handwheel toward you.
- 3. Open the cover below the needle plate so you can see the bobbin case.
- Lift the lever on the bobbin case and remove it from the sewing machine.
- 5. Leave a tail of about 3 to 4 inches of thread and place the bobbin in the bobbin case.
- 6. Hold the lever of the bobbin case and slide it onto the hook pin.
- 7. Let go of the lever and press it securely in place.
- 8. Leave the shuttle cover open until you thread the top thread and draw up the bobbin thread from the bottom.

Top-Loading/Drop-In Bobbin

- 1. Turn off the power.
- 2. Raise the presser foot.
- 3. Make sure the needle is in its highest position by using the handwheel.
- 4. Remove the bobbin cover plate.
- 5. Place the bobbin in the bobbin case with the thread running in a specific direction.
- 6. Pull the bobbin thread through the thread channels as described in the instruction manual. Leave a 4-5 inch tail.
- 7. Replace the bobbin cover plate.



Lesson 7: How to Thread Your Machine

- 1. Turn off the power to the sewing machine.
- 2. Raise the presser foot.
- 3. Raise the needle to the highest position by turning the handwheel toward you.
- 4. Put the spool of thread on the spool pin.
- 5. Move the thread over the top of the machine through the thread guide(s).
- 6. Bring the thread down, around, up through the eye of the take-up lever, and then down again passing it through the thread guide near the top of the needle.
- 7. Carefully thread the needle from front to back.
- 8. Pull at least 4-5 inches of thread through the needle to the back of the machine. It should move smoothly with little resistance.

Note: After you thread the machine, pull the bobbin thread up through the needle plate.






